


Requirements

All students must apply the approved for study abroad. Study abortos open to any CSU student who meets the following criteria:

- 2.0 cumulative GPA or higher (3.0 orghier required of graduate students)
- 1 successful semester if a transfer student
- 2 successful semestersniew first-year student
- Not have received any sanctions in viidatof the Student Conduct Code including: recommendation of expulsion, recommendation usfpension, discipling probation, reprimand, restitution, restriction, community seice, counseling, holds, or futer which would prevent success abroad as determined by the CSU Judicial Affairs Officer.
- · Good standing with the Offe of Treasury Services
- Fully enrolled in the semester of application; degree seeking
- Not be a current PSEOP student

Financial Aid Guide

What's the deadline to have my funding for study abroadsorted? All financial aid paperwork should be submitted and finalized by the following dates:

- x Fall semester programs July 15th
- x Spring semester programs November 15th.
- x Summer semester programs April 15th.
- x For all intersession programs follow applicable individual program deadline dates.

How do I fund a StudyAbroad financial

A cost of Attendance for each program is required so that the Financial Aid Office can review and make the necessary changes to the student's financial aid package for the intended term abroad. The additional costs for study abroad, may in some instances, result in additional aid eligibility. For less expensive programs, aid funding may be reduced to match the reduced costs.

Are there any limitations on aid for certain programs? It is important to plan in advance and check with the study abroad advisor and financial aid (All in One Enrollment Services) to see if your financial aid can apply to the study abroad program that you are advisor if advabeetain
